- GED is the process of earning the equivalent of your high school diploma, which is called a GED certificate or credential.
- GED candidates are required to study for, take, and pass tests that measure high-school level skills and knowledge.

### The GED Test has five parts

#### 1. Language Arts, Writing:

- Part 1: Organization, Sentence Structure, Usage, and Mechanics
- Part 2: Essay

#### 2. Language Arts, Reading:

- Poetry
- Drama
- Fiction
- Non-fiction
- Workplace documents

#### 3. Social Studies:

- History
- Geography
- Civics and Government
- Economics

#### 4. Science:

- Physical Science
- Life Science
- Earth & Space Science

#### 5. Mathematics:

- Number operation & number sense
- Measurement and geometry
- Data analysis, statistics, and probability
- Algebra, functions, and patterns

#### How Well Do You Need to Score?

Each of the five GED tests has a maximum score of 800. The highest possible score for all five tests is 4000 points. The average high school graduate scores 500 on each test, or a total of 2,500 points. The GED test is scored based on this average. You must pass each test with a minimum score of 410 with an average of 450.
